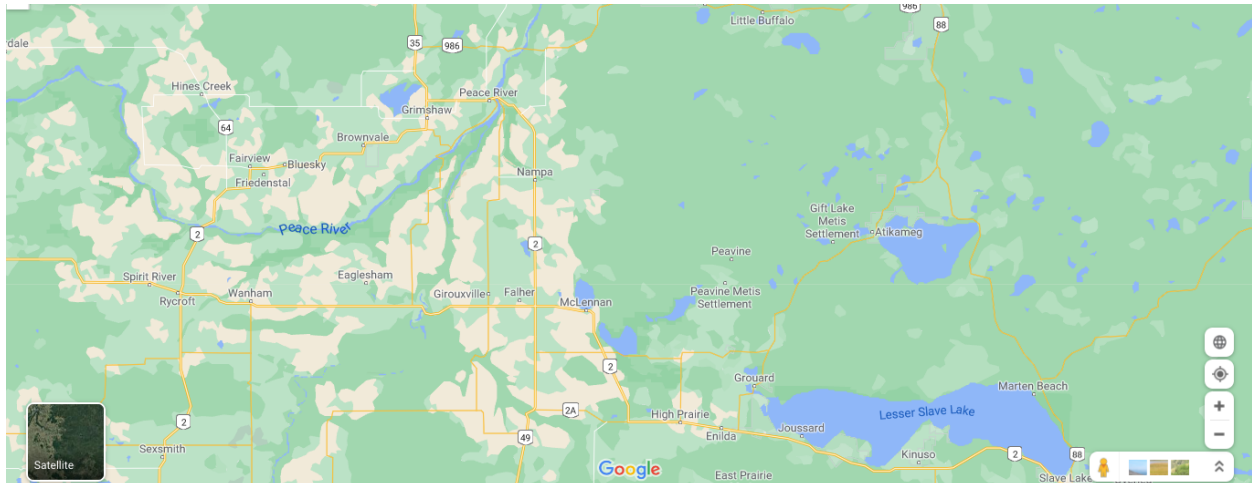

## Waterways of High Prairie



High Prairie is in between the Athabasca River and Peace River on the shore of Lesser Slave Lake. Lesser Slave Lake is one of Alberta's largest bodies of water and had an important role in the history of the fur trade. Lesser Slave Lake is 1,168 km<sup>2</sup> in area and 100 km in length. Peace River and Athabasca River are two of three of the largest rivers in Alberta and they supply water to the Peace-Athabasca Delta, which is one of the largest freshwater deltas in the world with wetlands of international significance. The Peace/Slave River Basin is composed of the Smoky River, Wapiti River, Little Smoky River, and Wabasca River.
