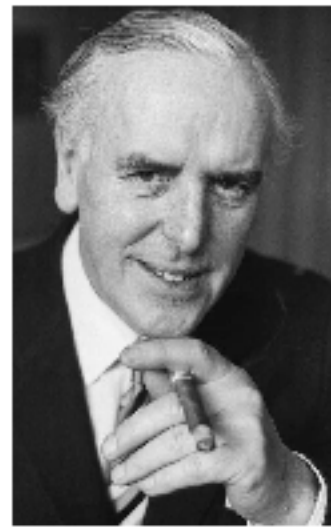




Mark Strand was an American poet recognized as a premier American poet of his generation, an editor, translator, and writer who was born and raised in Charlottetown, PEI in his early life.



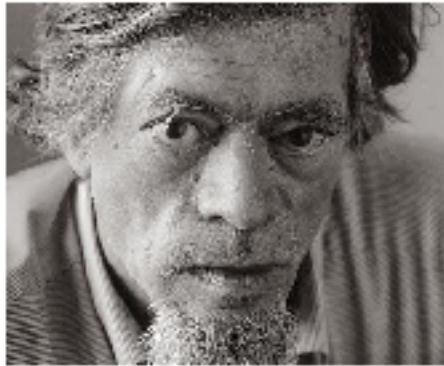
George Coles was one of the "Fathers of Confederation" who represented Prince Edward Island in the conferences held in Charlottetown, PEI.

Charles Andrew MacGillvary was a soldier and recipient of the Medal of Honor for his actions as a Sergeant in the United States Army during World War II. He was born in Charlottetown, PEI and died in Brockton, Massachusetts.



Frederick Thornton Peters was a Captain and recipient of the Victoria Cross, one of the highest awards for valour that can be awarded to British and Commonwealth forces.



L.M. Montgomery's Cavendish is the birthplace of the Anne of Green Gables books written by Lucy Maud Montgomery.



Lucy Maud Montgomery wrote the famous Anne of Green Gables books that was an immediate success throughout Prince Edward Island and Canada.
