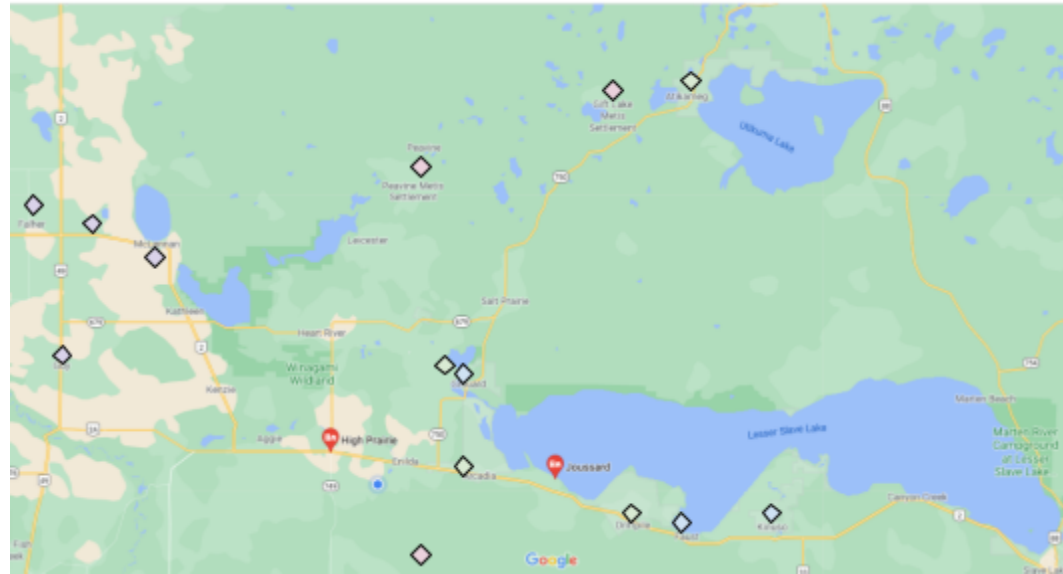


THIS! IS CANADA

### Communities in the High Prairie Region

Lesser Slave Lake has been important in the development of Alberta. Originally, Grouard, the hamlet beside Lesser Slave Lake, was supposed to be the capital of Alberta, due to its accessibility to the potential railroad, Lesser Slave Lake, and its former importance in the fur trade, but a mix-up in the water samples caused the railroad to run through High Prairie instead. High Prairie was an agricultural community, making Grouard the fur trade community. This area is a prime spot for agriculture, due to its flat land, fertile topsoil, and trees to stop erosion.
